# **ROUND TABLE DISCUSSION ITEMS**

1. Collaborating and Sharing Investment Function Resources – Continue Discussion from Jackie Flippin's presentation as needed.

- 2. TOT: Tourism Business Improvement Districts (TBID). Over 50 in place in California.
  - a. Any downside to establishing?
  - b. What percent extra are TBIDs requesting to be charged in addition to current TOT? (1%, 2%, 3%)
  - c. Problems between large and small establishments?
- 3. Public Records Act Do any Counties have detailed procedures and guidelines?
- 4. RFP's Has anyone gone out for Banking Services recently. How long to transition to the new bank. Any suggestions?
- 5. Cost Recovery For Fees Charged: Are there costs to provide services to particular tax payers that are still more than the amount Tax Collectors can legally charge?
  - a. Are there fees that should have clearer justification by code?
  - b. What services should be charged to individual tax payers that are not?
- 6. Teeter Issues?
- 7. Noticing Parties of Interest and Posting Properties for Auction: What issues surround these procedures that need clarification?
- 8. BIA property: 'Any land held in trust by the Department of Interior through the Bureau of Indian Affairs for tribes or individual Indians is exempt from real and personal property taxation as such property is considered owned by the United States and thus, immune from taxation'. (Article XIII, Section 1 of the California Constitution)
